Queens Community Board 2 raised many concerns when City officials charged (no

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CB 2 questions mayor's vision of city

Western Queens residents again expressed their suspicions of Mayor Bloomberg's sweeping PlaNYC 2030 after city officials presented an update to Community Board 2, which covers Woodside and Sunnyside.

With a decision on the specifics of congestion pricing soon to arrive, many residents worried that the borough's mass transit system would not be able to handle the increase in riders.

He warned people that permit parking would not be a catch-all cure for the district's parking woes. "It won't let you park in front of your door every night," he said.

Board members were also fed up with city workers abusing their municipal parking permits.

Conley said another planning concern for western Queens is hospital space. Between the additional 1 million residents expected in the city by 2030 and the increasing elderly population, another hospital will probably be needed to accommodate residents' health needs.

Board members also criticized the city for allowing development to outpace the infrastructure in Queens.
