There Are No Guarantees:

A new Quinnipiac College poll ("Q-Poll") finds what most of new already:

"New York state residents oppose Mayor Bloomberg's congestionpricing plan," according to the *New York Post*.

Asked, "if the money would, as pledged, be used to improve mass transit," the resounding response:

"both urban and rural drivers have their doubts that politicians would keep that promise."

As noted in the New York Post, not just the public questions the "promise" (only eight percent queried said the funding is "very likely"):

"So were politicians who spoke at a City Council hearing at which officials were bombarded for hours with questions about the congestion pricing plan."

"The record is mixed," said Assemblyman Richard Brodsky (D-Westchester). "Anyone who promises that this money will not be touched for anything else is ignoring history."
