The issues that "ruled out" the Ravitch scheme (Editorial: "Thrown under the bus: State Senate Dems deliver higher fares, worse service," April 7, 2009) clearly indicate the blame falls not on courageous legislators in the State Senate as well as many of their Assembly colleagues but those to thought to impose such an unsound scheme in the first place. When both the City Comptroller and the non-partisan NYC Independent Budget Office both find that nearly two-thirds of those subject to proposed tolls on the currently free East River and Harlem River bridges live in the five boroughs and come predominantly from Brooklyn and Queens, it makes clear how unfair and inequitable that part of the scheme remains. Keep NYC Free developed a sound set of alternatives advocated by our coalition of civic, business and labor organizations.
