Mayor de Blasio slams 'inconceivable' congestion pricing plan backed by Gov. Cuomo

Charging drivers to enter the most traffic-clogged parts of Manhattan is "inconceivable" even with Gov. Cuomo's support, Mayor de Blasio said Monday.

De Blasio made his strongest comments yet against congestion pricing a week after Cuomo publicly backed the idea and said he planned to put his full weight behind it.

"I've never been in favor of this strategy. **I've never seen an example of it that I thought was fair**," de Blasio told reporters at an unrelated press conference in Brooklyn. "I'm always going to keep an open mind, but ... I happen to be someone who does not believe in it."



Cuomo has not released any details of his plan, and de Blasio said things could change if what he comes up with is dramatically different than past proposals.

Aside from the difficulty of getting a plan through Albany, de Blasio didn't like the idea on the merits—saying even the version that would lower some tolls isn't equitable. Asked if he wants to see drivers paying in any form to enter parts of Manhattan by the end of the second term, he showed no interest in the idea.
