Speaking Out Against Congestion Pricing

I am pleased to see Mayor Bill de Blasio has already come out against it and my office will continue to work with him and the rest of my colleagues in government to advocate against its implementation.

Statement from Councilman I. Daneek Miller on Governor Andrew M. Cuomo's Statements on Congestion Pricing:

"The MTA must not charge those living in transportation deserts to subsidize those who already enjoy access to the subway system, especially those who live in luxury in Manhattan. No matter the new details of this scheme, and no matter how you cut it, this will be a regressive tax that hurts working families. Plus, those residents who will pay the new tolls will not realize any benefits and these increased costs will hurt our local businesses. Better ways exist and make sense to resource the MTA to not only pay for needed repairs but also increase access and make the entire system more accessible and equitable for the entire City, and I and my colleagues will continue to advocate for these reforms."
