Benefit Wealthier New Yorkers Over Working Class Drivers: Group

New York-Oct. 4... New York's unelected Traffic Mobility Review Board readily

admits that about half of all vehicle traffic south of 60th Street in Manhattan is

caused by for-hire vehicles like Uber and Lyft and by Yellow cabs. Working class

New Yorkers can't afford such transportation luxuries. Why then would the Traffic

Mobility Review Board, in its ever-evolving wisdom, exempt cabs and for-hire

vehicles at the expense of lower-income New Yorkers simply looking to get to

work? The Board is now suggesting a dedicated rider fee of between \$1 and \$2.75

for New Yorkers riding in taxis or For-Hire vehicles south of 60th Street, while

ordinary New Yorkers — who can't afford those services — will be stuck with a

fee of up to \$23 for entering the paywalled zone by car.
